- 1. What primary methods does the author use to develop and support the arguments? Explain how one or more of the following are used, giving examples.
  - Mainly facts
  - Statistical data
  - Feelings, opinions, intuition
  - Expert opinions
  - Definitions
- 2. What elements of the author's craft are primarily used to impact the quality of the text? Explain how one or more of the following are used, giving examples.
  - Analogies, similes, metaphors
  - Connotation
  - Technical vocabulary
- 3. How effectively does the author maintain objectivity in presenting information? Support your responses by citing examples from the text of the author's objectivity or subjectivity.

## Objectivity

- Does the author support arguments from a variety of sources of information?
- Do the points the author is trying to make follow each other in logical order?
- Is the author's reasoning sound?
- Are there facts provided to support each of the claims the author is making?
- Are those facts from credible sources?

## Subjectivity

- Does the author withhold information?
- Does the author stack the deck with only one side of the issue?
- Does the author offer only arguments that support one position?
- Does the author make assumptions without proving them for the reader?
