### Front of Card: Active Listening

When you are not sharing your ideas, engage in active listening. If you notice that your attention begins to wander away to something else, notice this and return to listening to your peer.

### Active listening looks like:

Making eye contact

Nodding

Silently noting ideas that you want to comment on

Allowing your classmate to finish their thought

## Active listening sounds like:

Affirming your peer's ideas and asking clarifying questions:

- "Mmhmm."
- "Right?"
- "And what did you mean by \_\_\_\_\_?

## Active listening feels like:

People care about what you have to say.

You are a valued member of your group.

Your ideas are carefully considered by your group members.
