

Figure 5.13: Listen to Your Inner Voice— Slide Presentation Requirements

Please follow these directions when creating your slide presentation.

Slide 1: Include a title slide with an image that illustrates the focus of your research.

Slide 2: Offer three research questions and directly connect the questions to the focus of your research.

Slide 3: Provide an introduction that includes a highly detailed explanation of your research rationale and answers the question, How did you come to select this focus area?

Slides 4–6: Directly connect evidence found in the sources to each of your research questions and include a citation.

Slide 7: Create an infographic that provides visual data of your research illustrating something interesting that you discovered.

Slide 8: Provide a multimedia link or a video or audio clip that shares evidence of your final research project. You can create a three-to-five-minute TED Talk, podcast episode, digital story, mind map, conceptual art piece, 3-D model, blog, interactive simulation or experience, or another student-generated, teacher-approved idea.

Slide 9: Include a works cited page for your three sources and any data included on your infographic.

Slide 10: Give one fact that made you say “I didn’t know this before!” What’s the coolest thing you learned about your topic? You must demonstrate new learning.

Slide 11: Finish your presentation with a meet the researcher slide (include any details you want).
