Participation
☐ The percentage of classrooms using prescribed strategies or tools increases.
☐ The number of students participating in activities or interventions associated with the initiative increases.
☐ The number of families and community members participating in initiative activities increases.
☐ Partnerships with local organizations or stakeholders increase.
☐ Student attendance and engagement increase.
☐ The number of teachers participating in professional learning opportunities increases.
School Commitment or Institutionalization
☐ The inclusion of initiative-related items on meeting agendas increases.
☐ Consistent and continuous improvement in instructional practices is observed and documented.
☐ The school staff consistently demonstrate the ability to effectively allocate and manage resources in implementing initiatives.
☐ Schedules are in place that are conducive to initiative implementation.
 Policies, routines, and systems created during the initiative are part of the school's standard operating procedures.
District and School Leadership Support
☐ The time that school and system leaders spend in classrooms or in meetings that support the initiative increases.
☐ Specific feedback given to teachers about initiative implementation increases.
☐ Funding is allocated for initiative-related activities.
☐ Systems are in place to train and prepare staff to sustain efforts.
Use of Initiative Materials and Tools
☐ The number of teachers observed effectively and consistently using the materials and tools increases.

Collaboration
☐ The inclusion of initiative-related topics on collaborative planning agendas increases.

☐ The time allotted for teacher and staff collaboration increases.

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Capacity Building for Scaling Improvements and Innovations Independently
☐ Improvement in staff's confidence and skills to implement changes without relying on external guidance is observed.
☐ Clear and actionable plans for continuing and scaling initiatives are developed and implemented.
☐ The regular and pervasive use of data and evaluations to make decisions about the effectiveness of initiative efforts increases.
☐ Reports or presentations demonstrate how the school has expanded successful practices to new areas or contexts.
Satisfaction With the Initiative
