

Writing Application Practice: Moves That Conclude

After teaching your students one of these moves—or all of these moves—you'll be looking for an opportunity for them to practice these skills immediately.

For each writing task, we have provided a prompt you could use to get your students writing. They can use this prompt to practice a single move for that writing task or to begin combining, mixing, and matching moves. You can find all writing application practice from the whole book in one place in appendix C (page 275).

Content Area	Writing Application Practice
English	Choose a conclusion move to help wrap up the reading that you have done today in class.
Mathematics	Think about a problem you worked on today in class. Use one of the conclusion moves to sum up your experience working on that problem.
Science	A science experiment always ends in the scientist drawing a conclusion about their hypothesis. Consider a recent experiment in science class. How might you use one of these conclusion moves to help you reflect on the outcome of your experiment?
Social Studies	We're willing to bet at least one of your classmates was absent today. (If not, we can pretend!) Use one of the conclusion moves to wrap up what you learned in class today for a classmate who was absent.
