## Writing Application Practice: Moves That Describe

After teaching your students one of these moves—or all of these moves—you'll be looking for an opportunity for them to practice these skills immediately.

For each writing task, we have provided a prompt you could use to get your students writing. They can use this prompt to practice a single move for that writing task or to begin combining, mixing, and matching moves. You can find all writing application practice from the whole book in one place in appendix C (page 275).

Content Area	Writing Application Practice
English	Describe a moment from your life—just a few minutes—that has left a powerful imprint on your memory. Which moves that describe can help you bring this moment to life for a reader?
Mathematics	Describe how you solved the hardest problem in last night's mathematics homework. Find a move (or moves) that describes to help you.
Science	Describe the process you used to conduct an experiment or lab. How might the moves that describe help you make your process clear and vivid to a reader?
Social Studies	Use the Library of Congress or another database to locate a primary source that relates to a current topic you have studied in social studies. Use a move or multiple moves that describe to help your reader see that source.
