Writing Application Practice: Moves That Provide Evidence

After teaching your students one of these moves—or all of these moves—you'll be looking for an opportunity for them to practice these skills immediately.

For each writing task, we have provided a prompt you could use to get your students writing. They can use this prompt to practice a single move for that writing task or to begin combining, mixing, and matching moves. You can find all writing application practice from the whole book in one place in appendix C (page 275).

Content Area	Writing Application Practice
English	Evaluate how the setting of the novel you most recently read influences or affects one of the characters. Use one of the moves from this chapter to incorporate evidence from the text in your response.
Mathematics	Explain and evaluate how you solved your most recent mathematical problem. Use one of the moves from this chapter to incorporate evidence, either from the textbook or with a visual of your own work, in your response.
Science	Consider the most recent experiment you have conducted or studied in class. Choose one independent variable from the experiment, and explain how the increase or decrease of this variable would affect the results of the experiment. Be sure to include evidence in your response using one of the moves from this chapter.
Social Studies	Evaluate how the most recent event that you learned about in this class affected a person or group of people. Use one of the moves from this chapter to incorporate evidence into your response.
