Clarify What were you confused by in the reading? How did you figure it out?	Understand Concepts Find a meaningful quote or concept from the text. Then draw a symbol or picture of it.	Connect Explain how a quote or concept you select connects with your life, other historical time periods, or the world today.
Pose Questions Pose questions that begin with <i>who</i> , <i>what</i> , <i>where</i> , <i>when</i> , <i>why</i> , and <i>how</i> . Answer any of them that you can.	Compare and Contrast Compare and contrast aspects of the text, such as different characters' or individuals' beliefs or actions, settings, or writers' styles.	Predict Predict the impact of a topic, theme, or concept from the text on the world today. Or predict what will happen next.
Answer Questions Select and respond to a guiding question. Incorporate textual evidence in your response.	React Choose and react to some part of the text. Consider what made you angry, think differently, disagree, agree, hope, rejoice, or react in another way.	Summarize Provide a three-sentence summary of what you learned in a selected reading passage.
