

FIGURE 3.1: PROCESS CHECKLIST FOR THE IMAGE PROJECT

- Find an image that matters to you and record where and when you found it.
- Draft an explanation of why the image matters.
- Do background research about the image—when, where, and by whom it was taken—and record your sources.
- Analyze the image much as you would a literary text.
- Combine your explanation, information, and analysis into a caption (maximum 250 words).
- Use the formative rubric to guide revision of your caption.
- Meet with your peer feedback group to focus on language and voice.
- Create a document that includes your image, caption, and sources.
- Post your document to a class website or blog.
- Write a reflection on both the process and the completed project.

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
