Last Stop on Market Street	Matt de la Peña (2015)	This is the story of an African American boy and his grandmother, which addresses socioeconomic differences between the boy and his friends.
Passage to Freedom: The Sugihara Story	Ken Mochizuki (2010)	In this story of a young Japanese boy and his family during World War II, the father helps Jewish refugees flee to safety.
When Jackie and Hank Met	Cathy Goldberg Fishman (2012)	In this story, African American baseball player Jackie Robinson and Jewish baseball player Hank Greenberg experience many common hardships due to a lack of acceptance of differences during the 1940s and 1950s.
