Food costs for animals can vary drastically. You can find food for an ant farm in a kitchen. An ant farm requires very little maintenance, whereas a guinea pig may require hay and grass pellets, as well as fresh food daily to help with digestion. The frequency of feeding, as well as food costs, can play large factors in deciding which classroom animal works for you.

To calculate your total food costs, you will need a conversion chart or the internet.

**Example:** Guinea pig food comes in a 2-lb. bag. Based on the preceding data, the guinea pig requires 2 cups of food per week. This would be 16 oz. per week. A 2-lb. bag is 32 oz. Therefore, 2 lbs. of guinea pig food will last for two weeks.

\*Estimate smaller food sources such as mealworms.
