Positive School Culture	Negative School Culture
★ Vision and mission: They are shared among stakeholders, and everyone owns them.	★ Vision and mission: They belong to the principal alone; there is no shared ownership.
★ Relationships: They are positive.	★ Relationships: They are strained or individualistic.
★ Collegiality: We are in this together, and this is our school. Let's collaborate on this.	★ Collegiality: It is lacking. There are cliques and loners. People think, "We can do this our way, and this is my classroom."
★ Leadership: All voices matter and everyone has strengths.	★ Leadership: There is one leader and one voice.
★ Clarity: Everyone knows the work that is being done.	★ Clarity: It is lacking. There is chaos. Everyone has their own understanding of what to do.
★ Behavior: Everyone has participated in the development and models the expectations. Positive behavior is taught, modeled, and reinforced.	★ Behavior: It is addressed inconsistently. Staff ignore misbehavior. The school feels unsafe.
★ Professional learning: High-quality professional learning is provided to staff and students. There is positive risk taking.	★ Professional learning: The group agrees that they should keep doing it the way they have always done it.
★ Celebrations: Successes are recognized and promote the work of all stakeholders.	★ Celebrations: They only recognize certain individuals and create resentment.
★ Expectations and support: Expectations and support are high.	★ Expectations and support: There are low or no expectations and support.
